SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the

A BILL FOR AN ACT 1

- Relating to state financial administration; and declaring an emergency.
- Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. <u>SECTION 3a.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$37,500,000 is established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, for expenditures of proceeds from state bonds issued for the benefit of a community college, pursuant to agreements between the commission and a community college.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> The project approvals and expenditure limitations in sections 1, 2, 3 and 3a of this 2023 Act and the expenditure limitations established by the Emergency Board during the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, for capital construction or acquisition projects, expire on June 30, 2029, unless otherwise noted.
