5 are established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limits for pay-
6 ment of expenses from federal funds collected or received by the state agencies listed, for
7 the acquisition of land and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing, fur-
8 nishing and equipping of buildings and facilities:

26 \$327,713,551 is established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limit
27 for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Re-
28 cepts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Higher
29 Education Coordinating Commission, for expenditures of proceeds from state bonds issued
30 for the benefit of a public university, pursuant to agreements between the commission and
31 a public university.

32 “SECTION 3a. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
33 \$37,500,000 is established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limit
34 for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Re-
35 cepts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Higher
36 Education Coordinating Commission, for expenditures of proceeds from state bonds issued
37 for the benefit of a community college, pursuant to agreements between the commission and
38 a community college.

39 “SECTION 4. The project approvals and expenditure limitations in sections 1, 2, 3 and 3a
40 of this 2023 Act and the expenditure limitations established by the Emergency Board during
41 the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, for capital construction or acquisition projects, expire
42 on June 30, 2029, unless otherwise noted.

33 “**SECTION 6.** The Legislative Assembly approves the proposal of the Oregon Military
34 Department, submitted in accordance with ORS 396.515 (4), for the sale of the Christmas
35 Valley property which consists of 2,655 acres of land in Christmas Valley, Oregon.

36 “**SECTION 7.** This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
37 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect
38 July 1, 2023.”.

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
