## A-Engrossed House Bill 5040

Ordered by the House June 2 Including House Amendments dated June 2

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Concurrent Resolution 23 (2023) (at the request of Oregon Department of Administrative Services)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Transportation for certain biennial expenses.

Limits certain biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and certain federal funds, but excluding lottery funds and other federal funds, collected or received by department.

Limits certain biennial expenditures by department from other federal funds. Limits certain biennial expenditures by department from lottery moneys.

Authorizes specified nonlimited expenditures.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2023.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the financial administration of the Department of Transportation; and declaring an 3 emergency.

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4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 SECTION 1. There is appropriated to the Department of Transportation, for the biennium

beginning July 1, 2023, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$16,930,280 for debt service
on the State Radio Project and highway improvement projects.

8 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts

are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal funds received as reimbursement from the United States Department of Transportation,

12 but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in this section, collected or re-

13 ceived by the Department of Transportation, for the following purposes:

<u>SECTION 4.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$136,144,810 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the Department of Transportation for debt service.

23 <u>SECTION 5.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$650,000 24 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limit for payment of 25 expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Veterans' Services Fund established under 26 ORS 406.140 to the Department of Veterans' Affairs and transferred to the Department of 27 Transportation for veteran transit services.

<u>SECTION 6.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$19,000,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the Department of Transportation from American Rescue Plan Act Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund moneys received by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services and transferred to the Department of Transportation, for the Newberg-Dundee Bypass Project.

34 <u>SECTION 7.</u> For the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, expenditures by the Department 35 of Transportation from federal funds for debt service on Build America Bonds are not lim-36 ited.

37 <u>SECTION 8.</u> For the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, expenditures by the Department 38 of Transportation from the Oregon Transportation Infrastructure Fund established under 39 ORS 367.015 for debt service and for internally reimbursed expenditures are not limited.

40 <u>SECTION 9.</u> This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 41 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect 42 July 1, 2023.

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
