# **A-Engrossed** House Bill 5047

### SUMMARY

#### 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT Relating to state financial administration; and declaring an emergency. $\mathbf{2}$ 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (1), chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2021, 5 6 for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, for central services, is increased by \$8,000,000 to re-7 balance the agency's budget. 8 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation 9 made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (3), chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2021, 10 for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, for self-sufficiency programs, is increased by \$7,053,076 11 to rebalance the agency's budget. 12SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation 13 made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (5), chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2021, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, for child welfare programs, is decreased by \$11,022,962 14 15 to rebalance the agency's budget. 16 SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (6), chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2021, 17for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, for aging and people with disabilities programs, is 18 19 decreased by \$41,021,547 to rebalance the agency's budget. 20SECTION 5. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation 21made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (7), chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2021, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, for intellectual/developmental disabilities programs, 22

23is decreased by \$54,063,391 to rebalance the agency's budget.

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SECTION 6. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on 1 2 expenditures established by section 2 (3), chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2021, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or 3 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal 4 funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries 5 and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not 6 described in section 2, chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2021, collected or received by the Depart-7 ment of Human Services, for self-sufficiency programs, is decreased by \$15,646 to rebalance 8 9 the agency's budget.

SECTION 7. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on 10 expenditures established by section 2 (5), chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2021, for the biennium 11 12 ending June 30, 2023, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal 13 funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries 14 15 and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not 16 described in section 2, chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2021, collected or received by the Department of Human Services, for child welfare programs, is decreased by \$169,988 to rebalance 17 18 the agency's budget.

<u>SECTION 8.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 3 (5), chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2021, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds, excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2021, collected or received by the Department of Human Services, for child welfare programs, is decreased by \$3,854,006 to rebalance the agency's budget.

25 <u>SECTION 9.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on 26 expenditures established by section 3 (6), chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2021, for the biennium 27 ending June 30, 2023, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds, 28 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2021, collected or 29 received by the Department of Human Services, for aging and people with disabilities pro-30 grams, is decreased by \$91,001,900 to rebalance the agency's budget.

<u>SECTION 10.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 3 (7), chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2021, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds, excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2021, collected or received by the Department of Human Services, for intellectual/developmental disabilities programs, is increased by \$28,961,764 to rebalance the agency's budget.

SECTION 11. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation
made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 1 (1), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2021, for the
biennium ending June 30, 2023, for health systems, health policy and analytics, and public
health, is decreased by \$135,228,179 to rebalance the agency's budget.

<u>SECTION 12.</u> Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation
made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 1 (3), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2021, for the
biennium ending June 30, 2023, for central services, state assessments and enterprise-wide
costs, is decreased by \$14,013,925 to rebalance the agency's budget.

SECTION 13. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation

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1 made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 1 (2), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2021, for the

2 biennium ending June 30, 2023, for the Oregon State Hospital, is increased by \$6,678,251 to

3 rebalance the agency's budget.

4 <u>SECTION 14.</u> Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation 5 made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 11, chapter 554, Oregon Laws 2021, for the 6 biennium ending June 30, 2023, for carrying out the amendments to ORS 413.201 and 414.231 7 by sections 1 and 2, chapter 554, Oregon Laws 2021, is increased by \$4,045,761 to rebalance 8 the agency's budget.

9 SECTION 15. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2021, for the biennium 10 ending June 30, 2023, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or 11 12 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, tobacco tax receipts, marijuana tax receipts, beer and wine tax receipts, provider taxes and Medicare receipts, but excluding lot-13 tery funds and federal funds not described in section 2, chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2021, 14 15 collected or received by the Oregon Health Authority, for health systems, health policy and 16analytics, and public health, is increased by \$8,617 to rebalance the agency's budget.

SECTION 16. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on 1718 expenditures established by section 2 (2), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2021, for the biennium 19 ending June 30, 2023, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or 20other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, tobacco tax receipts, marijuana tax receipts, beer and wine tax receipts, provider taxes and Medicare receipts, but excluding lot-2122tery funds and federal funds not described in section 2, chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2021, 23collected or received by the Oregon Health Authority, for the Oregon State Hospital, is decreased by \$6,678,251 to rebalance the agency's budget. 24

25 <u>SECTION 17.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on 26 expenditures established by section 5 (1), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2021, for the biennium 27 ending June 30, 2023, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds, 28 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2021, collected or 29 received by the Oregon Health Authority, for health systems, health policy and analytics, and 30 public health, is decreased by \$353,697,133 to rebalance the agency's budget.

<u>SECTION 18.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 5 (3), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2021, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds, excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2021, collected or received by the Oregon Health Authority, for central services, state assessments and enterprise-wide costs, is increased by \$3,000,000 to rebalance the agency's budget.

37 <u>SECTION 19.</u> This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 38 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect 39 on its passage.

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
