

## SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 1044

1 Delete lines 4 through 11 of the printed bill and insert:

2 **“SECTION 1. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-**  
3 **riated to the Oregon Health Authority, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the**  
4 **General Fund, the amount of \$74,200,000, which shall be expended as follows:**

5 **“(1) \$6,000,000 for transition case management for individuals discharged from the**  
6 **Oregon State Hospital who are at risk of homelessness;**

7 **“(2) \$10,000,000 for community mental health programs to provide outreach to, treatment**  
8 **for and engagement of individuals with mental illness for whom civil commitment pro-**  
9 **ceedings have been initiated under ORS 426.070 and after civil commitment proceedings have**  
10 **been dismissed, if needed to provide stability to the individuals and give them access to**  
11 **treatment;**

12 **“(3) \$4,900,000 for community mental health programs to expand jail diversion services;**

13 **“(4) \$2,300,000 to expand children’s psychiatric residential treatment capacity;**

14 **“(5) \$8,300,000 to:**

15 **“(a) Expand access to behavioral rehabilitation services to all medical assistance recipi-**  
16 **ents in need of the services; and**

17 **“(b) Support the expansion of service hubs for youth who are transitioning to adulthood;**

18 **“(6) \$7,700,000 to expand child and adult suicide prevention, intervention and post-**  
19 **intervention services to reduce suicides in this state;**

20 **“(7) \$15,000,000 for substance use disorder facilities and recovery centers; and**

21 **“(8) \$20,000,000 for the health care provider incentive program created in ORS 676.454 to**  
22 **recruit and retain diverse health care providers and attract providers to underserved areas.**

23 **“SECTION 2. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-**  
24 **riated to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, for the biennium beginning July**  
25 **1, 2023, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$1,500,000, to be distributed to the Oregon**  
26 **Health and Science University to coordinate the availability of behavioral health residential**  
27 **beds statewide.**

28 **“SECTION 3. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-**  
29 **riated to the Department of Human Services, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out**  
30 **of the General Fund, the amount of \$4,000,000, which shall be expended for long term care**  
31 **facility behavioral health specialty care.**

32 **“SECTION 4. This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**  
33 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect**  
34 **July 1, 2023.”.**
