Senate Bill 19

Sponsored by Senator GORSEK (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Prohibits peace officer, school resource officer or special campus security officer from conducting custodial interview with person under 18 years of age unless person has consulted with attorney.

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT
2	Relating to custodial interviews of persons under 18 years of age.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section:
5	(a) "Custodial interview" means an interview in which the person questioned is in cus-
6	tody and is required to be advised of the person's constitutional rights.
7	(b) "Peace officer" has the meaning given that term in ORS 133.005.
8	(c) "School resource officer" means a peace officer who is assigned to a school.
9	(d) "Special campus security officer" means a special campus security officer described
10	in ORS 352.118.
11	(2) A peace officer, school resource officer or special campus security officer may not
12	conduct a custodial interview with a person under 18 years of age unless the person has
13	consulted with an attorney, either in person, by phone or by video conference.
14	SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2023 Act applies to custodial interviews occurring on or
15	after the effective date of this 2023 Act.
