## **SUMMARY**

Repeals sunset on requirement for Department of Corrections to provide training for basic certification of corrections officers employed by department.

5	SECTION 1. Section 46b, chapter 885, Oregon Laws 2009, as amended by section 1, chapter 573,
6	Oregon Laws 2013, is amended to read:
7	Sec. 46b. [(1)] Section 44, chapter 885, Oregon Laws 2009, applies to corrections officers hired
8	by the Department of Corrections on or after August 4, 2009[, and before January 2, 2026].
9	[(2) Nothing in the repeal of section 44, chapter 885, Oregon Laws 2009, by section 46d, chapter
10	885, Oregon Laws 2009:]
11	[(a) Prohibits the Department of Corrections from completing the basic training of corrections offi-
12	cers who are hired on or after August 4, 2009, and before January 2, 2026.]
13	[(b) Affects the certification, or the eligibility for certification, of a corrections officer who is pro-
14	vided basic training by the Department of Corrections in accordance with section 44, chapter 885,
15	Oregon Laws 2009.]
16	SECTION 2. Section 46d, chapter 885, Oregon Laws 2009, as amended by section 2, chap-
17	ter 573, Oregon Laws 2013, is repealed.
