

Senate Bill 278

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires separate calculation of virtual public charter school ADMw if school district that sponsors virtual public charter school had decrease in ADMw as compared to previous school year. Applies to State School Fund distributions commencing with 2022-2023 distributions. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

1
2 Relating to calculations of district extended ADMw; creating new provisions; amending ORS 338.155;
3 and declaring an emergency.

4 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 338.155 is amended to read:

6 338.155. (1)(a) Students of a public charter school shall be considered to be residents of the
7 school district in which the public charter school is located for purposes of distribution of the State
8 School Fund.

9 (b) All amounts to be distributed from the State School Fund for public charter schools shall
10 first be distributed to the school district in which the public charter school is located.

11 (c) For the purpose of determining the amounts to be distributed to a school district from the
12 State School Fund for a public charter school, the district extended ADMw described in ORS 327.013
13 shall be calculated:

14 (A) Except as provided by subparagraph (B) or (C) of this paragraph, as though the students
15 enrolled at a public charter school are students enrolled at the public schools of the school district
16 in which the public charter school is located.

17 (B) By not including any portion of the ADM of the public charter school for the previous school
18 year if the public charter school ceased to operate because of dissolution or closure or because of
19 termination or nonrenewal of a charter.

20 (C) By calculating the current school year's ADMw separately for a virtual public charter
21 school and for the school district if the school district, without consideration of the ADM of the
22 virtual public charter school, had a decrease in ADM **or ADMw** compared to the previous school
23 year.

24 (2) A school district shall contractually establish, with any public charter school that is spon-
25 sored by the board of the school district, payment for provision of educational services to the public
26 charter school's students. The payment shall equal an amount per weighted average daily member-
27 ship (ADMw) of the public charter school that is at least equal to:

28 (a) Eighty percent of the amount of the school district's General Purpose Grant per ADMw as
29 calculated under ORS 327.013 for students who are enrolled in kindergarten through grade eight;

NOTE: Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter *[italic and bracketed]* is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

2 (b) Ninety-five percent of the amount of the school district’s General Purpose Grant per ADMw
 3 as calculated under ORS 327.013 for students who are enrolled in grades 9 through 12.

4 (3) A school district shall contractually establish, with any public charter school that is spon-
 5 sored by the State Board of Education and that is within the boundaries of the school district,
 6 payment for provision of educational services to the public charter school’s students. The payment
 7 shall equal an amount per weighted average daily membership (ADMw) of the public charter school
 8 that is at least equal to:

9 (a) Ninety percent of the amount of the school district’s General Purpose Grant per ADMw as
 10 calculated under ORS 327.013 for students who are enrolled in kindergarten through grade eight;
 11 and

12 (b) Ninety-five percent of the amount of the school district’s General Purpose Grant per ADMw
 13 as calculated under ORS 327.013 for students who are enrolled in grades 9 through 12.

14 (4) The estimated amount of each school district’s General Purpose Grant per ADMw shall be
 15 determined each year by the Department of Education and made available to all school districts.

16 (5) The school district in which the public charter school is located shall transfer an amount
 17 per weighted average daily membership (ADMw) of the public charter school that is equal to 50
 18 percent of the amount of the school district’s General Purpose Grant per ADMw as calculated under
 19 ORS 327.013 that is not paid to the public charter school through a contract created pursuant to
 20 subsection (3) of this section to the Department of Education.

21 (6) The department may use any moneys received under this section for activities related to
 22 public charter schools.

23 (7) A school district and a public charter school may negotiate to establish a payment for the
 24 provision of educational services to the public charter school’s students that is more than the min-
 25 imum amounts specified in subsection (2) or (3) of this section.

26 (8) A school district shall send payment to a public charter school based on a contract negoti-
 27 ated under this section within 10 days after receiving payments from the State School Fund pursuant
 28 to ORS 327.095.

29 (9)(a) A public charter school may apply for any grant that is available to school districts or
 30 nonchartered public schools from the Department of Education. The department shall consider the
 31 application of the public charter school in the same manner as an application from a school district
 32 or nonchartered public school.

33 (b) The department shall award any grant that is available to school districts based solely on
 34 the weighted average daily membership (ADMw) of the school district directly to the public charter
 35 school. This paragraph does not apply to any grant from the State School Fund.

36 **SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 338.155 by section 1 of this 2023 Act apply to State**
 37 **School Fund distributions commencing with the 2022-2023 distributions.**

38 **SECTION 3. This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
 39 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect**
 40 **on its passage.**

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
