Senate Bill 287

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Directs Teacher Standards and Practices Commission to adopt specified rules to increase number of teachers who are deaf or hard of hearing or who are training to work with children who are deaf or hard of hearing.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the licensure of teachers requiring specialized training related to a disability; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 342.127. 3

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4

SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2023 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 342.120 to 5 6 342.430.

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7 SECTION 2. The Teacher Standards and Practices Commission shall adopt rules that promote an increase in the number of teachers who are deaf or hard of hearing or who are 8 9 trained to work with children who are deaf or hard of hearing. The rules shall allow for:

10 (1) The determination and approval under ORS 342.147 of out-of-state educator preparation programs that specialize in training candidates who are deaf or hard of hearing, or 11 training candidates to work with children who are deaf or hard of hearing, when the com-12 13 mission determines that insufficient programs are available in this state to provide that training. 14

(2) The issuance of a license to an out-of-state applicant who has completed a course of 15 study from an educator preparation program approved as provided by subsection (1) of this 16 section without the need of the applicant to satisfy any licensure requirements prescribed 17 by another state. 18

(3) The waiver of the fee prescribed under ORS 342.127 (2) for the evaluation of an ap-19 20plicant requesting licensing based upon completion of an educator preparation program other than an Oregon approved educator preparation program. Nothing in this subsection prohibits 21the commission from collecting any fee that otherwise would be imposed on an applicant who 22 completed an Oregon approved educator preparation program. 23

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SECTION 3. ORS 342.127 is amended to read:

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342.127. (1) The Teacher Standards and Practices Commission shall establish and collect:

26(a) A fee not to exceed \$350 for evaluation of the initial application for each educator license 27 for which application is made. If the applicant is eligible for the educator license for which appli-28 cation is made, the commission shall issue the license without additional charge.

29(b) A fee not to exceed \$350 for the renewal of each educator license and a fee not to exceed \$50 for each official paper license. If the educator is certified by a national professional organization 30

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1 for teaching standards recognized by the commission, the commission shall renew the license with-2 out charge.

3 (c) A fee not to exceed \$800 for a beginning educator assessment conducted in lieu of an ap-4 proved preparation program required for licensure.

5 (d) A fee not to exceed \$350 for registration as a public charter school teacher or administrator 6 that includes any fee charged pursuant to rules adopted under ORS 181A.195.

(e) A fee not to exceed \$350 for renewal of a registration as a public charter school teacher or
administrator that includes any fee charged pursuant to rules adopted under ORS 181A.195.

9 (2) In addition to the fee required by subsection (1) of this section for the issuance of an edu-10 cator license **and except as provided by section 2 of this 2023 Act**, the commission shall collect 11 a fee not to exceed \$150 for the evaluation of an applicant requesting licensing based upon com-12 pletion of an educator preparation program other than an Oregon approved educator preparation 13 program.

(3) In addition to the fees required by subsection (1) of this section, the commission shall collect a late application fee not to exceed \$40 per month up to a maximum of \$200 from an applicant who fails to make timely application for renewal of the license or registration. The actual amount of the fee shall be determined in accordance with rules of the commission.

(4) In addition to the fees required by subsection (1) of this section, the commission shall collect
a late application fee not to exceed \$350 for the reinstatement of an expired license. The requirements for reinstatement and the actual amount of the fee shall be determined in accordance with
rules of the commission.

(5) Notwithstanding the expiration date posted on the license, the license shall continue to be
valid for an additional 120 days, provided the educator has made a timely application, as determined
by the commission, for renewal prior to the expiration date on the license.

(6) In addition to the fee required by subsection (1) of this section for the issuance of an educator license, the commission shall collect a fee not to exceed \$1,000 for the reinstatement of a license that has been suspended or revoked by the commission for gross neglect of duty or gross unfitness under ORS 342.175.

(7) In addition to the fee required by subsection (1) of this section for the issuance of an educator license, the commission shall collect a fee not to exceed \$200 for the issuance of any license through an expedited process under ORS 342.125 (6) at the request of any school district, public charter school or education service district that seeks to employ the applicant. The fee shall be paid by the school district, public charter school or education service district.

34 (8)(a) The commission shall establish and collect:

(A) A fee for each approved educator preparation provider, based on the number of license applications received by the commission from the provider; and

(B) A fee for each approved educator preparation provider, based on the type of educator prep-aration programs that the provider offers.

(b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a) of this subsection, the commission may establish and collect
a flat fee for the purposes described in paragraph (a) of this subsection if the number of teacher
applicants enrolled in the educator preparation programs offered by the educator preparation provider does not exceed a number identified by the commission by rule.

43 (c) The method for determining the fee and the actual amount of the fee imposed under this44 subsection shall be determined in accordance with rules of the commission.

45 (9) Fees established under this section shall cover, but not exceed, the full cost of administrative

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1 expenses incurred by the commission during any biennium.

2 **SECTION 4.** ORS 342.127, as amended by section 4, chapter 647, Oregon Laws 2021, is amended 3 to read:

4 342.127. (1) The Teacher Standards and Practices Commission shall establish and collect:

a fee not to exceed \$150 for the evaluation of an applicant requesting licensing based upon completion of an educator preparation program other than an Oregon approved educator preparation
program.

(3) In addition to the fees required by subsection (1) of this section, the commission shall collect
a late application fee not to exceed \$40 per month up to a maximum of \$200 from an applicant who
fails to make timely application for renewal of the license or registration. The actual amount of the
fee shall be determined in accordance with rules of the commission.

(4) In addition to the fees required by subsection (1) of this section, the commission shall collect a late application fee not to exceed \$350 for the reinstatement of an expired license. The requirements for reinstatement and the actual amount of the fee shall be determined in accordance with rules of the commission.

(5) Notwithstanding the expiration date posted on the license, the license shall continue to be
valid for an additional 120 days, provided the educator has made a timely application, as determined
by the commission, for renewal prior to the expiration date on the license.

(6) In addition to the fee required by subsection (1) of this section for the issuance of an educator license, the commission shall collect a fee not to exceed \$1,000 for the reinstatement of a license that has been suspended or revoked by the commission for gross neglect of duty or gross
unfitness under ORS 342.175.

(7) In addition to the fee required by subsection (1) of this section for the issuance of an educator license, the commission shall collect a fee not to exceed \$200 for the issuance of any license through an expedited process under ORS 342.125 (6) at the request of any school district, public charter school or education service district that seeks to employ the applicant. The fee shall be paid by the school district, public charter school or education service district.

(8) Fees established under this section shall cover, but not exceed, the full cost of administrative
expenses incurred by the commission during any biennium.

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
