

SENATE AMENDMENTS TO A-ENGROSSED SENATE BILL 292

1 On page 4 of the printed A-engrossed bill, line 8, after “of” delete the rest of the line and lines
2 9 and 10 and insert “4,000 or more students, as calculated without including the average daily
3 membership of any students enrolled in a virtual public charter school, as defined in ORS 338.005,
4 for which the district is the sponsor.”.

5 After line 42, insert:

6 “**SECTION 3.** ORS 244.050, as amended by section 1, chapter 66, Oregon Laws 2022, and section
7 1 of this 2023 Act, is amended to read:

8 “244.050. (1) On or before April 15 of each year the following persons shall file with the Oregon
9 Government Ethics Commission a verified statement of economic interest as required under this
10 chapter:

11 “(a) The Governor, Secretary of State, State Treasurer, Attorney General, Commissioner of the
12 Bureau of Labor and Industries, district attorneys and members of the Legislative Assembly.

13 “(b) Any judicial officer, including justices of the peace and municipal judges, except any pro
14 tem judicial officer who does not otherwise serve as a judicial officer.

15 “(c) Any candidate for a public office designated in paragraph (a) or (b) of this subsection.

16 “(d) The Deputy Attorney General.

17 “(e) The Deputy Secretary of State.

18 “(f) The Legislative Administrator, the Legislative Counsel, the Legislative Fiscal Officer, the
19 Legislative Policy and Research Director, the Secretary of the Senate, the Chief Clerk of the House
20 of Representatives and the Legislative Equity Officer.

21 “(g) The president and vice presidents, or their administrative equivalents, in each public uni-
22 versity listed in ORS 352.002.

23 “(h) The following state officers:

24 “(A) Adjutant General.

25 “(B) Director of Agriculture.

26 “(C) Manager of State Accident Insurance Fund Corporation.

27 “(D) Water Resources Director.

28 “(E) Director of the Department of Environmental Quality.

29 “(F) Director of the Oregon Department of Administrative Services.

30 “(G) State Fish and Wildlife Director.

31 “(H) State Forester.

32 “(I) State Geologist.

33 “(J) Director of Human Services.

43 executive officer thereof.
44 “(o) Each member of the board of directors of the State Accident Insurance Fund Corporation.
45 “(p) The chief administrative officer and the financial officer of each common and union high

1 school district, education service district and community college district.

2 “(q) Every member of the following state boards, commissions and councils:

3 “(A) Governing board of the State Department of Geology and Mineral Industries.

4 “(B) Oregon Business Development Commission.

5 “(C) State Board of Education.

6 “(D) Environmental Quality Commission.

7 “(E) Fish and Wildlife Commission of the State of Oregon.

8 “(F) State Board of Forestry.

9 “(G) Oregon Government Ethics Commission.

10 “(H) Oregon Health Policy Board.

11 “(I) Oregon Investment Council.

12 “(J) Land Conservation and Development Commission.

13 “(K) Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission.

14 “(L) Oregon Short Term Fund Board.

15 “(M) State Marine Board.

16 “(N) Mass transit district boards.

17 “(O) Energy Facility Siting Council.

18 “(P) Board of Commissioners of the Port of Portland.

19 “(Q) Employment Relations Board.

20 “(R) Public Employees Retirement Board.

21 “(S) Oregon Racing Commission.

22 “(T) Oregon Transportation Commission.

23 “(U) Water Resources Commission.

24 “(V) Workers’ Compensation Board.

25 “(W) Oregon Facilities Authority.

26 “(X) Oregon State Lottery Commission.

27 “(Y) Pacific Northwest Electric Power and Conservation Planning Council.

28 “(Z) Columbia River Gorge Commission.

29 “(AA) Oregon Health and Science University Board of Directors.

33 “(EE) Early Learning Council.

34 “(FF) The Oversight and Accountability Council.

35 “(r) The following officers of the State Treasurer:

36 “(A) Deputy State Treasurer.

37 “(B) Chief of staff for the office of the State Treasurer.

38 “(C) Director of the Investment Division.

39 “(s) Every member of the board of commissioners of a port governed by ORS 777.005 to 777.725

40 or 777.915 to 777.953.

41 “(t) Every member of the board of directors of an authority created under ORS 441.525 to

42 441.595.

43 “(u) Every member of a governing board of a public university listed in ORS 352.002.

44 “(v) Every member of the district school board of a common school district or union high school

45 district *[if the district has an average daily membership, as defined in ORS 327.006, of 4,000 or more*

1 *students, as calculated without including the average daily membership of any students enrolled in a*
2 *virtual public charter school, as defined in ORS 338.005, for which the district is the sponsor].*

3 “(w) Every member of the board of directors of an authority created under ORS 465.600 to
4 465.621.

5 “(2) By April 15 next after the date an appointment takes effect, every appointed public official
6 on a board or commission listed in subsection (1) of this section shall file with the Oregon Govern-
7 ment Ethics Commission a statement of economic interest as required under ORS 244.060, 244.070
8 and 244.090.

9 “(3) By April 15 next after the filing deadline for the primary election, each candidate described
10 in subsection (1) of this section shall file with the commission a statement of economic interest as
11 required under ORS 244.060, 244.070 and 244.090.

12 “(4) Not later than the 40th day before the date of the statewide general election, each candi-
13 date described in subsection (1) of this section who will appear on the statewide general election
14 ballot and who was not required to file a statement of economic interest under subsections (1) to (3)
15 of this section shall file with the commission a statement of economic interest as required under
16 ORS 244.060, 244.070 and 244.090.

17 “(5) Subsections (1) to (3) of this section apply only to persons who are incumbent, elected or
18 appointed public officials as of April 15 and to persons who are candidates on April 15.

19 “(6) If a statement required to be filed under this section has not been received by the com-
20 mission within five days after the date the statement is due, the commission shall notify the public
21 official or candidate and give the public official or candidate not less than 15 days to comply with
22 the requirements of this section. If the public official or candidate fails to comply by the date set
23 by the commission, the commission may impose a civil penalty as provided in ORS 244.350.

24 “**SECTION 4. (1) The amendments to ORS 244.050 by section 3 of this 2023 Act become**
25 **operative on January 1, 2026.**

26 “**(2) In calendar years 2024, 2025 and 2026, the Oregon Government Ethics Commission,**
27 **in collaboration with the Department of Education, shall provide training on the require-**
28 **ments of ORS 244.050, as amended by section 3 of this 2023 Act, to members of district school**
29 **boards required to file a verified statement of economic interest under ORS 244.050 after**
30 **January 1, 2026.”.**

31 In line 43, delete “3” and insert “5”.
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
