## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Requires Oregon State Bar to study attorneys. Directs Oregon State Bar to submit findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary not later than September 15, 2024.] Provides that public university is required to make annual report on use of outside counsel for legal matters available on website, rather than provide report to Attorney Gen-

eral.

Repeals requirement for Attorney General to report to committee or interim committee of Legislative Assembly on use of outside counsel by public universities.

4	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
5	SECTION 1. ORS 352.132 is amended to read:
6	352.132. (1) A public university listed in ORS 352.002 shall [report annually to the Attorney Gen-
7	eral on] annually make available on the university's website a report describing the university's
8	use of outside counsel for legal matters. The report must include:
9	(a) The types of matters handled by outside counsel;
10	(b) The number of litigation matters handled by outside counsel; and
11	(c) The total amount spent on outside counsel, categorized by type of matter.
12	(2) Reports under this section may be altered to protect the privacy of students and university
13	employees and to comply with the federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (20 U.S.C.
14	1232g), the federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act, the attorney-client privi-
15	lege, or other state and federal confidentiality rules.
16	SECTION 2. Sections 2 and 3, chapter 675, Oregon Laws 2021, are repealed.
