## A-Engrossed Senate Bill 401

Ordered by the Senate March 2 Including Senate Amendments dated March 2

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to study tardive dyskinesia and other related involuntary movement disorders. Directs authority to submit findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to public health and health care not later than September 15, 2024. Sunsets January 2, 2025.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to tardive dyskinesia.

**Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Oregon Health Authority shall study tardive dyskinesia and other 5 related involuntary movement disorders. The study must:

(a) Analyze existing resources for patients, providers and caregivers in this state.

7 (b) Identify opportunities to expand existing resources for patients, providers and 8 caregivers in this state.

9 (c) Develop recommendations to ensure minority populations have equitable access to 10 existing and expanded resources for patients, providers and caregivers in this state.

11 (d) Explain the authority's strategic plan to implement the opportunities identified under

paragraph (b) of this subsection and the recommendations developed under paragraph (c) of
this subsection.

(2) The authority shall provide the results of the study in a report to the interim com mittees of the Legislative Assembly related to public health and health care in the manner
provided under ORS 192.245 no later than September 15, 2024.

17 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2023 Act is repealed on January 2, 2025.
