Allows person taking certain nuisance game mammals to offer meat to charitable organization or retain meat.

2	Relating to the use of meat.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, "charitable organization" and "game meat" have
5	the meanings given those terms in ORS 619.095.
6	(2) A person who takes an antelope, bighorn sheep, deer, elk, moose or mountain goat
7	under a permit described in ORS 498.012 may:
8	(a) Offer the game meat to a charitable organization;
9	(b) Retain the game meat for private, noncommercial use; or
10	(c) Make any disposition authorized by the State Fish and Wildlife Commission by rule.
