Senate Bill 5502

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Concurrent Resolution 23 (2023) (at the request of Oregon Department of Administrative Services)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Department of Administrative Services for certain biennial expenses.

Limits certain biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and certain federal funds, but excluding lottery funds and other federal funds, collected or received by department.

Limits biennial expenditures by department from certain lottery moneys.

Limits biennial expenditures by department from federal funds. Authorizes specified nonlimited expenditures.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2023.

 <u>SECTION 3.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$47,431,606 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund for debt service and related costs for bonds issued in previous biennia.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$3,828,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses to support the county fairs in this state from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services that are deposited in the County Fair Account established under ORS 565.445.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$5,559,169 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds collected or received by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services.

<u>SECTION 6.</u> For the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, the following expenditures by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services are not limited:

- (1) Expenditures from the Insurance Fund for acquiring and purchasing insurance or reinsurance, allocating and collecting premiums and paying claims for coverage pursuant to statutory authority.
- (2) Expenditures from the Mass Transit Assistance Account for payments described in ORS 291.407 to mass transit districts, transportation districts and service districts.

SECTION 7. This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect July 1, 2023.
