SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Long Term Care Ombudsman for biennial expenses. Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal Older Americans Act funds received from Department of Human Services, but excluding lottery funds and other federal funds, collected or received by Long Term Care Ombudsman.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2023.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 <u>SECTION 1.</u> There are appropriated to the Long Term Care Ombudsman, for the 6 biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the General Fund, the following amounts for the fol-7 lowing purposes:

13 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$903,651 14 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limit for payment of 15 expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, and in-16 cluding federal Older Americans Act funds received from the Department of Human Services, 17 but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in this section, collected or re-18 ceived by the Long Term Care Ombudsman.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect
July 1, 2023.
