

SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 5524

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 5 through 27 and delete pages 2 and 3 and insert:

2 “**SECTION 1.** There are appropriated to the Oregon Business Development Department,
3 for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the General Fund, the following amounts for
4 the following purposes:

7 “**SECTION 2.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there are appro-
8 priated to the Oregon Business Development Department, for the biennium beginning July
9 1, 2023, out of the General Fund, for infrastructure, the following amounts for the following
10 purposes:

22 “**SECTION 3.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there are appro-
23 priated to the Oregon Business Development Department, for the biennium beginning July
24 1, 2023, out of the General Fund, for business, innovation and trade, the following amounts
25 for the following purposes:

26 (1) Emerging Opportunities
27 Program \$ 13,500,000

28 (2) Municipal wildfire assistance.... \$ 1,000,000

29 “**SECTION 4.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts
30 are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limits for payment
31 of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but ex-
32 cluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Business Devel-
33 opment Department, for the following purposes:

34 (1) Operations..... \$ 4,253,298

35 (2) Business, innovation

- 1 and trade..... \$245,344,891
- 2 (3) Infrastructure..... \$215,788,458
- 3 (4) Arts..... \$ 18,228,924

4 “**SECTION 5.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts
5 are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limits for payment
6 of expenses by the Oregon Business Development Department, from American Rescue Plan
7 Act Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund moneys received by the Oregon Department of
8 Administrative Services and transferred to the Oregon Business Development Department,
9 for the following purposes:

- 10 (1) Operations..... \$ 360,477
- 11 (2) Business, innovation
12 and trade..... \$ 408,641

13 “**SECTION 6.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
14 \$267,642,183 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limit for
15 payment of expenses by the Oregon Business Development Department, from American
16 Rescue Plan Act Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund moneys received by the Oregon
17 Department of Administrative Services and transferred to the Oregon Business Development
18 Department, for infrastructure, for grants approved in section 196, chapter 669, Oregon Laws
19 2021.

20 “**SECTION 7.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts
21 are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limits for payment
22 of expenses by the Oregon Business Development Department, from the Broadband Fund
23 established by section 4, chapter 17, Oregon Laws 2020, for the following purposes:

- 24 (1) Operations..... \$ 380,782
- 25 (2) Infrastructure..... \$106,619,218

26 “**SECTION 8.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts
27 are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limits for payment
28 of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic De-
29 velopment Fund to the Oregon Business Development Department, for the following pur-
30 poses:

- 31 (1) Operations..... \$ 15,436,848
- 32 (2) Business, innovation
33 and trade..... \$ 77,456,902
- 34 (3) Infrastructure..... \$ 4,591,498
- 35 (4) Oregon Film and Video Office .. \$ 1,479,463
- 36 (5) Lottery bond debt service..... \$ 47,504,550

37 “**SECTION 9.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts
38 are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limits for payment
39 of expenses from federal funds collected or received by the Oregon Business Development
40 Department, for the following purposes:

- 41 (1) Operations..... \$ 633,078
- 42 (2) Business, innovation
43 and trade..... \$ 37,258,810
- 44 (3) Infrastructure..... \$ 57,803,364
- 45 (4) Arts..... \$ 2,208,982

1 **SECTION 10.** For the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, expenditures by the Oregon
2 Business Development Department are not limited for:
3 **“(1) Loans from the following funds:**
4 **“(a) Oregon Business Development Fund (ORS 285B.092), Oregon Entrepreneurial Devel-**
5 **opment Loan Fund (ORS 285B.758), Credit Enhancement Fund (ORS 285B.215) and Small**
6 **Business Expansion Loan Fund (ORS 285B.133).**
7 **“(b) Special Public Works Fund (ORS 285B.455), Water Fund (ORS 285B.563), Marine**
8 **Navigation Improvement Fund (ORS 777.267), Oregon Port Revolving Fund (ORS 285A.708),**
9 **Safe Drinking Water Revolving Loan Fund (ORS 285A.213), Brownfields Redevelopment Fund**
10 **(ORS 285A.188) and Oregon Brownfield Properties Revitalization Fund (ORS 285A.198).**
11 **“(2) Debt service, excluding debt service on lottery revenue bonds and general obligation**
12 **bonds.**
13 **SECTION 11.** This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
14 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect
15 July 1, 2023.”.
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
