Modifies specified General Fund appropriations for biennium ending June 30, 2023. Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Emergency Board for allocation to commis-

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2023.

 - SECTION 1. There are appropriated to the Public Defense Services Commission, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the General Fund, the following amounts, for the following purposes:

SECTION 3. (1) In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Emergency Board, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$3,000,000, to be allocated to the Public Defense Services Commission for Adult Trial Division or Juvenile Trial Division caseload costs the commission is unable to mitigate during the interim legislative periods.

(2) If any of the moneys appropriated by subsection (1) of this section are not allocated by the Emergency Board prior to December 1, 2024, the moneys remaining on that date become available for any purpose for which the Emergency Board lawfully may allocate funds.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to the Public Defense Services Commission by section 1 (5), chapter 444, Oregon Laws 2021, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, for Nonroutine Expenses, is decreased by \$413,560.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to the Public Defense Services Commission by section 1 (6), chapter 444, Oregon Laws 2021, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, for Court Mandated Expenses, is decreased by \$3,396,146.

<u>SECTION 6.</u> This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect July 1, 2023.
