40 **“Sec. 2.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are estab-
41 lished for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2021, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses
42 from federal funds collected or received by the state agencies listed, for the acquisition of land and
43 the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equipping of buildings and
44 facilities:

12 Oregon Laws 2022, is amended to read:

13 **“Sec. 3.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of [~~\$475,905,100~~]
14 **\$455,905,100** is established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for
15 payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but
16 excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Higher Education Coordi-
17 nating Commission, for expenditures of proceeds from state bonds issued for the benefit of a public
18 university, pursuant to agreements between the commission and a public university.

19 **“SECTION 4. This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
20 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect**
21 **on its passage.”.**
