Senate Bill 652

Sponsored by Senator KNOPP; Senators ANDERSON, GIROD (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires vision examination as part of evaluation before initially receiving special education.

$\frac{1}{2}$	Relating to evaluations for special education; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 343.146.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. ORS 343.146 is amended to read:
5	343.146. (1) To receive special education, children with disabilities shall be determined eligible
6	for special education services under a school district program approved under ORS 343.045 and as
7	provided under ORS 343.221.
8	(2) Before initially providing special education, the school district shall ensure that a full and
9	individual evaluation is conducted to determine the child's eligibility for special education and the
10	child's special educational needs. An evaluation conducted under this subsection must include
11	a vision examination.
12	(3) Eligibility for special education shall be determined pursuant to rules adopted by the State
13	Board of Education.
14	(4) Each school district shall conduct a reevaluation of each child with a disability in accord-
15	ance with rules adopted by the State Board of Education.
16	(5) If a medical examination is required as part of an initial evaluation or reevaluation, the ex-
17	amination must be given by:
18	(a) A physician licensed under ORS chapter 677 or by the appropriate authority in another state;
19	(b) A naturopathic physician licensed under ORS chapter 685 or by the appropriate authority in
20	another state;
21	(c) A nurse practitioner licensed under ORS 678.375 to 678.390 or by the appropriate authority
22	in another state; or
23	(d) A physician assistant licensed under ORS 677.505 to 677.525 or by the appropriate authority
24	in another state.
25	(6) If a vision examination is required as part of an initial evaluation or reevaluation, the ex-
26	amination must be given by:
27	(a) A person licensed to practice optometry under ORS chapter 683 or by the appropriate au-
28	thority in another state; or
29	(b) A physician who specializes in ophthalmology and who is licensed under ORS chapter 677
30	or by the appropriate authority in another state.
31	(7) If an audiological assessment is required as part of an initial evaluation or reevaluation, the
32	assessment must be given by an audiologist licensed under ORS chapter 681 or by the appropriate

1 authority in another state.

2 (8) The information obtained in an examination or assessment performed under subsection (5),

3 (6) or (7) of this section must be reported by the practitioner who performed the examination or
4 assessment to the school district in which the child is or will be enrolled.

5 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The amendments to ORS 343.146 by section 1 of this 2023 Act apply to eval-6 uations conducted on or after the effective date of this 2023 Act.
