## A-Engrossed Senate Bill 956

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Instructs Water Resources [Commission] **Department** to take certain actions related to Walla Walla Water 2050 Strategic Plan.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the Walla Walla River Basin.

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**3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Water Resources Department shall collaborate with the Confeder-5 ated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation and the State of Washington to implement 6 and guide cooperative, bistate water management in the Walla Walla River Basin under the 7 Walla Walla Water 2050 Strategic Plan, under advice from a Walla Walla River Basin advi-8 sory committee consisting of representatives from a broad range of interests, including ag-9 ricultural, environmental and other stakeholders and federal, tribal, state and local 10 governments.

(2) The Legislative Assembly declares that it is the intent of this 2023 Act that:

(a) This state shall share in the cost of implementing the Walla Walla Water 2050 Stra tegic Plan.

(b) At least one-half of the total costs of implementing the Walla Walla Water 2050
Strategic Plan will be funded through federal, private and other nonstate sources, including
funding from private entities that benefit from projects under the Walla Walla Water 2050
Strategic Plan.

(3) The department shall implement the Walla Walla Water 2050 Strategic Plan as an
 integrated water resources approach that invites coordination among this state and the
 State of Washington, affected federally recognized Indian tribes, agencies and community
 stakeholders, including stakeholders concerned with agriculture, the environment and busi ness.

(4) In developing water supply solutions in the Walla Walla River Basin, the department
shall use an integrated water resources management approach that provides concurrent
water supply benefits to in-stream, out-of-stream and ground water uses and addresses a
variety of water resource and ecosystem challenges affecting fish passage, habitat functions
and agricultural, municipal, industrial and domestic water supply, consistent with the Walla
Walla Water 2050 Strategic Plan.

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1 (5) In consultation with affected federally recognized Indian tribes, and in cooperation 2 with the State of Washington, the department shall assess the development of a legal and 3 regulatory framework, coordinated between this state and the State of Washington, for the 4 allocation, distribution and management of developed water resources.

5 (6) Agencies, as defined in ORS 183.310, in undertaking the agencies' programs or using 6 moneys appropriated by the Legislative Assembly, may, consistent with all other statutory 7 limitations or direction concerning the agencies' programs or use of the moneys, fund the 8 study, design, engineering and construction of projects implementing the Walla Walla Water 9 2050 Strategic Plan that are located wholly or partially in the State of Washington if the 10 projects:

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(a) Benefit in-stream, out-of-stream or ground water demands in this state; and

12 (b) Are consistent with the objectives of the Walla Walla Water 2050 Strategic Plan.

13 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) On or before June 30, 2025, the Water Resources Department shall sub-14 mit a report, in the manner prescribed in ORS 192.245, to a committee or interim committee 15 of the Legislative Assembly related to water that contains recommendations for a legal and 16 regulatory framework to promote equitable allocation, distribution and management of de-17 veloped water resources and water supplies resulting from projects undertaken under the 18 Walla Walla Water 2050 Strategic Plan.

(2) In coordination with the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation and the State of Washington, the department shall report three times in 2024, and three times in 2025 before the date specified in subsection (1) of this section, to the Walla Walla River Basin advisory committee described in section 1 (1) of this 2023 Act on the development of a legal and regulatory framework, coordinated between this state and the State of Washington, for the allocation, distribution and management of developed water resources, as described in section 1 (5) of this 2023 Act.

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
