PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 603

On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 26 and delete pages 2 2 and 3 and insert:

"SECTION 1. (1) The People's Housing Assistance Fund Demon-3 stration Program is established in the Department of Human Services 4 for the purpose of testing the effectiveness of a guaranteed income 5 program in improving the well-being and the quality of life for 6 Oregonians who face housing insecurity, housing instability and 7 homelessness. Households participating in the program shall receive 8 monthly payments of \$1,000 for a 24-month period and may use the 9 payments at their discretion. 10

11 "(2) A household qualifies for the program if the household has 12 applied and qualified for, but is not receiving, housing assistance 13 through a housing voucher program or subsidized housing that is re-14 stricted to households earning 60 percent or less of the area median 15 income, as defined in ORS 458.610.

"(3) Payments received from the program are exempt from personal
 income taxation imposed by this state under ORS chapter 316 and may
 not count as income in the determination of eligibility for any needs based benefits or assistance provided with state funds only.

20 "(4) The department shall cap enrollment in the program based on 21 the availability of moneys appropriated by the Legislative Assembly 1 for the program.

"(5) The department shall adopt rules for the administration of the program in consultation with the Portland State University Homelessness Research and Action Collaborative and must ensure that the program's design, recruitment, enrollment and administration align with the purposes of the study described in section 2 of this 2023 Act.

8 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) The Portland State University Homelessness Re-9 search and Action Collaborative shall conduct a study evaluating the 10 effectiveness of the People's Housing Assistance Fund Demonstration 11 Program established in section 1 of this 2023 Act in improving the 12 well-being and quality of life for households participating in the pro-13 gram.

"(2) In conducting the study, the collaborative shall give special
 attention to outcomes for members of demographic groups that are
 disproportionately vulnerable to housing insecurity, housing instabil ity and homelessness, including groups defined by:

"(a) Geographic location and the size of the populations where the
 participant resides;

20 "(b) Racial and ethnic identity;

21 "(c) Current housing status; and

"(d) Household type, such as households including children and
 households including older adults.

"(3) The study shall build upon the existing body of research eval uating similar direct cash assistance programs nationwide.

"(4) The study shall employ a variety of research methods, including quantitative, qualitative and participatory action research methods, and document outcomes through a variety of means, including but not limited to statistics and narratives of participants' experiences. "SECTION 3. (1) No later than October 15, 2024, the Portland State University Homelessness Research and Action Collaborative shall provide a report, in the manner provided under ORS 192.245, to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to human services and housing. The report shall include:

"(a) Preliminary findings of the study carried out under section 2
of this 2023 Act, based on the experiences and outcomes of program
participants to-date.

9 "(b) Evaluation of preliminary study findings in relation to the 10 outcomes of similar cash assistance programs in other states or re-11 gions.

"(c) Recommendations for the design and implementation of a
 long-term direct cash assistance program administered by the State
 of Oregon, including but not limited to recommendations as to:

"(A) Ensuring efficient, effective and sustainable program admin istration;

"(B) Program design, including eligibility and direct cash assistance
 amount;

"(C) Overcoming barriers to participation, including but not limited
 to barriers related to geographic location, racial and ethnic identity,
 language, disability, immigration and citizenship status, and lack of
 permanent address; and

"(D) Preventing program participation from affecting participants'
 ability to qualify for and access other public benefits.

"(2) No later than six months following the conclusion of the 26 24-month People's Housing Assistance Fund Demonstration Program, 27 the collaborative shall provide a final report to the interim committees 28 of the Legislative Assembly related to human services and housing. 29 The report shall include:

30 "(a) Final, complete findings of the study carried out under section

1 2 of this 2023 Act.

"(b) An evaluation of any relevant studies or other documentation
of direct cash assistance programs in other states or regions that may
have been published following the collaborative's 2024 report.

"(c) An initial evaluation and rubric for future evaluation of any
long-term direct cash assistance program that may have been established by the State of Oregon.

"(3) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed, to the extent permitted by laws related to confidentiality, to furnish information and advice necessary for the collaborative to complete the study and reports described in this 2023 Act.

"SECTION 4. No later than December 1, 2024, the Department of 12 Human Services, based on the experience of the department in ad-13 ministering the People's Housing Assistance Fund Demonstration 14 Program under section 1 of this 2023 Act and the report of the Portland 15State University Homelessness Research and Action Collaborative un-16 der section 3 (1) of this 2023 Act, shall provide to the interim com-17 mittees of the Legislative Assembly related to human services and 18 housing a legislative concept, to be introduced in the 2025 regular 19 session of the Legislative Assembly, to implement a long-term cash 20assistance program. 21

"<u>SECTION 5.</u> In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Department of Human Services, for
the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the General Fund, the
amount of \$25,000,000, which may be expended for:

"(1) Making payments to participants in the People's Housing As sistance Fund Demonstration Program established in section 1 of this
 2023 Act;

"(2) Contracting with Portland State University to complete the
 study and reports described in sections 2 and 3 of this 2023 Act; and

"(3) Administration of the program if funds for administration are
not otherwise available.

3 "SECTION 6. Section 1 of this 2023 Act is repealed on January 2,
4 2028.

<u>SECTION 7.</u> This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect on its passage.".
