1 amount of [~~\$475,905,100~~] **\$455,905,100** is established for a six-year period be-
2 ginning July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from
3 fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but ex-
4 cluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Higher
5 Education Coordinating Commission, for expenditures of proceeds from state
6 bonds issued for the benefit of a public university, pursuant to agreements
7 between the commission and a public university.

8 **“SECTION 4. This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate**
9 **preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is**
10 **declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect on its passage.”.**

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
