PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 409

- On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 5 through 31.
- On page 2, delete lines 1 through 4 and insert:
- **"SECTION 1.** ORS 336.035 is amended to read:
- "336.035. (1)(a) [The] A district school board shall [see] ensure that the
- 5 courses of study prescribed by law and by the rules of the State Board of
- 6 Education are carried out.
- 7 "(b) [The] A district school board may establish supplemental courses
- 8 that are not inconsistent with the prescribed courses and may adopt courses
- 9 of study in lieu of state courses of study upon approval by the Superinten-
- 10 dent of Public Instruction.

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- "(2) For courses of study offered by a school district, the district
- school board shall ensure that the school district's website includes:
- "(a) A link to the webpage of the Department of Education that
- 14 lists the textbooks and other instructional materials adopted by the
- 15 State Board of Education under ORS 337.050; and
- 16 "(b) A link to the webpage of the Department of Education that
- 17 describes academic content standards for courses of study offered by
- 18 the school district.
- "[(2)] (3) Any district school board may establish a course of education
- 20 concerning sexually transmitted infections including recognition of causes,
- sources and symptoms, and the availability of diagnostic and treatment cen-

ters. Any such course established may be taught to adults from the commu-1 nity served by the individual schools as well as to students enrolled in the 2 school. The board shall cause the parents or guardians of minor students 3 to be notified in advance that the course is to be taught. Any such parent 4 or guardian may direct in writing that the minor child in the care of the 5 parent or guardian be excused from any class within the course. Any parent 6 or guardian may inspect the instructional materials to be used before or 7 during the time the course is taught. 8

"[(3)] (4) The district school board shall coordinate the course provided in subsection [(2)] (3) of this section with the officials of the local health department and the Superintendent of Public Instruction. Teachers holding endorsements for health education shall be used where available. A teacher may not be subject to discipline or removal for teaching or refusing to teach courses concerning sexually transmitted infections."

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
