PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 1079

- In line 2 of the printed bill, after "care" insert "; and declaring an emergency".
- 3 Delete lines 4 through 8 and insert:
- "SECTION 1. (1) The Governor shall appoint a task force consisting of:
- "(a) Five members representing hospitals, including at least one member each representing a type A hospital and a type B hospital, as described in ORS 442.470;
- 9 "(b) One member representing nurses;
- "(c) One member representing frontline workers in health care settings, including long term care facilities, acute care facilities, adult foster homes and in-home care;
- 13 "(d) One member representing long term care facilities including 14 skilled nursing facilities;
- 15 "(e) One member representing behavioral health care facilities;
- 16 "(f) One member representing consumers of health care;
- 17 "(g) One member representing commercial insurers that offer 18 health benefit plans; and
- 19 "(h) One member representing coordinated care organizations.
- 20 "(2) The task force shall recommend legislative and administrative 21 solutions to address the challenges faced by post-acute health care

1 systems including but not limited to:

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- "(a) Strategies to identify the appropriate number of beds, staff or services in the long term care, behavioral health care and other health care systems that are necessary for planning for the safe and effective discharge of patients from hospital settings;
- "(b) Policy changes needed to ensure an adequate number of beds and staff are available for the discharge of patients from post-acute facilities;
- 9 "(c) Identifying barriers to placing patients in existing post-acute 10 facilities when there is capacity and how to address the barriers;
 - "(d) State agency coordination and efficiencies needed to ensure that patient's needs are being met in the appropriate care setting; and
 - "(e) Any necessary federal approvals needed to establish federal and state partnerships on policy and for securing potential federal resources.
- 16 "(3) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a 17 quorum for the transaction of business.
 - "(4) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members of the task force.
- 20 "(5) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as 21 chairperson.
- 22 "(6) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the Governor shall make 23 an appointment to become immediately effective.
- 24 "(7) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the 25 call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the task 26 force.
- 27 "(8) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.
- 29 "(9) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided 30 by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to

- the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to health no later than September 15, 2023.
- 3 "(10) The Department of Human Services and the Oregon Health
 4 Authority shall provide staff support to the task force.
- "(11) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are not entitled to compensation or reimbursement for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task force.
- "SECTION 2. This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect on its passage."

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
