**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 1061**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after the semicolon insert “creating
2 new provisions; amending ORS 475C.939;”.

3 Delete lines 24 through 30 and delete page 2 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1.** ORS 475C.939 is amended to read:

5 “475C.939. (1) In addition to any other duty prescribed by law, the Oregon
6 Cannabis Commission shall:

7 “[1] (a) Provide advice to the Oregon Health Authority with respect to
8 the administration of ORS 475C.770 to 475C.919;

9 “[2] (b) Provide advice to the Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission
10 with respect to the administration of ORS 475C.005 to 475C.525, insofar as
11 those statutes pertain to registry identification cardholders and designated
12 primary caregivers, as those terms are defined in ORS 475C.777;

13 “[3] (c) Develop a long-term strategic plan for ensuring that cannabis
14 will remain a therapeutic option for persons with debilitating medical con-
15 ditions as defined in ORS 475C.777;

16 “[4] (d) Develop a long-term strategic plan for ensuring that cannabis
17 will remain affordable for persons with debilitating medical conditions as
18 defined in ORS 475C.777; and

19 “[5] (e) Monitor and study federal laws, regulations and policies re-
20 garding marijuana.

21 **“(2) The Oregon Cannabis Commission, the Oregon Health Author-**

1 ity and the Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission shall work
2 collaboratively to:

3 “(a) Determine the optimal framework for the continued
4 governance and administration of ORS 475C.770 to 475C.919 and steps
5 that the state must take, whether administrative or legislative in na-
6 ture, to continue to provide safe and affordable access to cannabis and
7 cannabis-derived products; and

8 “(b) Once every two years, submit a report in the manner provided
9 in ORS 192.245 to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly
10 related to health care and the judiciary on the status of the
11 governance and administration of ORS 475C.770 to 475C.919 and the
12 progress the Oregon Cannabis Commission has made, since the im-
13 mediately preceding report submitted as described in this paragraph,
14 in carrying out the commission’s duties described in this section and
15 as otherwise determined by the commission. As part of the report de-
16 scribed in this paragraph, the commission may make recommen-
17 dations for legislation.

18 “(3) As necessary to carry out the duties described in subsection (2)
19 of this section, the Oregon Cannabis Commission may collaborate and
20 consult with the chairpersons of the committees and interim commit-
21 tees of the Legislative Assembly related to health care and the judici-
22 ary.

23 “SECTION 2. The Oregon Cannabis Commission shall first report
24 as described in ORS 475C.939 not later than September 15, 2024.

25 “SECTION 3. This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate
26 preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
27 declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect on its passage.”.

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
