  - "(2) The department shall, by rule, establish policies and procedures for conducting the safety assessments under this section.
  - "SECTION 9. (1) Section 1 of this 2023 Act and the amendments to ORS 329A.030 by sections 2 and 3 of this 2023 Act apply to background checks completed on or after the effective date of this 2023 Act.
  - "(2) Section 8 of this 2023 Act and the amendments to ORS 419B.005 and 419B.020 by sections 4 to 6 of this 2023 Act apply to reports of abuse arising from acts occurring on or after the effective date of this 2023 Act.
  - "SECTION 10. This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect on its passage."

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
