Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from federal funds other than those described in section 2 of this 2023 Act, collected or received by the Department of Transportation, for the following purposes:

- 20 for internally reimbursed expenditures are not limited.
- "SECTION 9. This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate
- 22 preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
- declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect July 1, 2023.".

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
