Right now, Oregon is better suited than most other states to maintain food security despite a radically changing climate because we have preserved diverse farmland and do not need to be solely reliant on imports. We continue to have greater opportunities for fishing, hunting, and outdoor recreation because of our current land use laws as well. These are all important things to preserve for our future, and they should not be recklessly traded away. We could be building housing within our existing Urban Growth Boundaries already; yet we keep failing to, because of issues like single family zoning and a failure to fund appropriate infrastructure and actual construction of denser and more affordable housing.
