I am a resident of South Salem and I am also very active in voting method reform in Oregon. I am a volunteer petitioner of the STAR Voting initiative petition IP-11 which is currently gathering signatures in Oregon.

I am writing to ask you to vote NO on the ranked choice voting (RCV) bills 2004 and 3509 which I believe you will be voting on soon. While this may seem counterintuitive given my interest in voting method reform and more representative elections, the reasons are actually very simple:

-- RCV is an outdated 150 year old voting method with known pathologies. Modern election science has invented much better methods since then.

-- RCV gives some voters more power than others. Some people will have 2nd choices counted, others will not (even when the discarded ranking data is relevant!). -- RCV has been shown in academic studies to have similar benefits as regular voting with a top two runoff.

-- RCV still has vote-splitting!

-- RCV requires centralized tabulation, which decreases transparency and increases mistrust in the results.

-- This RCV bill is a top-down approach which does not give voters a chance to decide if it is the reform they want.

Our STAR Voting for Oregon ballot initiative will give voters the chance in 2024 to choose a voting reform that solves all of these problems. I believe the RCV lobby is also circulating their own initiative, so voters could have the option to vote for that one if they want.

Please let voters make this choice.
