I do NOT support HB2004! Rank choice voting does NOT represent the will of the people. It eliminates one person-one vote. Changing to RCV would be VERY expensive and the citizens should not have to pay for something so unnecessary. Oregon's AG has openly admitted that our current electronic voting systems are hackable; why would we want to provide the bad folks another avenue to hack our voting?
