Oregonians who experience intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) in rural counties are underserved due to lack of funding to cover to-and-from travel costs for attendant care providers.

In lieu of expensive, institutional-type care, people with IDD receive support in their homes to become as independent as possible. While family members often provide great care, other things must be considered such as aging parents, family members' needs to work outside of the home, burn out, etc. Also, unrelated support workers can often help a person progress in ways family members cannot.

By providing a mileage stipend for support workers, we can broaden the pool of availability to people with IDD and help them reach their goals and become more independent.HB 2500....

Emma's mom says, "having a PSW gives our daughter the freedom to experience life WITHOUT her mom and dad every minute. It is so enjoyable to see her learn and grow on her own. Having a PSW improves Emma's life and makes her goals possible!"




Support HB 2500
