Dear Chair Dembrow and members of the Senate Education Committee,

My name is Travis Magrane, and I am Executive Director at Youth Music Project, a non-profit organization in West Linn, OR dedicated to teaching music to kids.

I am reaching out today to urge passage of Senate Bill 531, that will appropriate money from the General Fund to the Department of Education for summer and after school programs.

Afterschool and summer programs are essential for the health and well-being of kids, families, and communities, and funding is a perennial issue. The benefits of out-of-school and afterschool programs, and music education are well known and documented. At Youth Music Project, 40% of enrollments since our inception in 2012 have been provided free of charge to low-income families in our community who otherwise wouldn't be able to afford access to programs such as ours. To provide this access, we rely substantially on foundation and government grant funds, and direct public support from individuals and businesses. Securing consistent funding is essential for our organizations success and ability to deliver on our mission. Access to summer programs – especially for low-income kids and families – and especially throughout the summer, is crucial in helping to shrink the opportunity gap for these kiddos.

The funding that has been provided to YMP through the states investment in 2021 and 2022 has been instrumental (pun intended!) in allowing us to continue to meet the communities need to provide affordable and accessible music education to youth in Clackamas County and beyond. Thanks to funds provided via Oregon Association of Service Districts in 2022, we were able to provide over 2,000 hours of classes, lessons, and camps to 712 students, with 300 low-income families attending at no-cost.
