Frank Moore was a founding member of the Steamboaters, a non-profit organization dedicated to the conservation, preservation, and restoration of the natural production of wild fish populations in the North Umpqua River. His devotion to the river was unparalleled and monumental in ensuring the future of wild fish. In 1968 Frank was avidly working on forest practice reforms in the Steamboat Creek Basin. His advocacy and dedication helped with the creation of "Pass Creek" a film used to show the harmful effects of clear-cut logging. Frank Moore's dedication to protecting wild steelhead habitat continued in 2019 with the protection of nearly one hundred thousand acres of land in the designation of the Frank and Jeanne Moore Wild Steelhead Sanctuary up Steamboat Creek.
