The effect would be much like COVID, your favorite restaurants close, while the TGI Fridays and Taco Bell come in and lease for pennies on the dollar because their inferior, from-powder food and low wages have enough margin to survive in any market. My father (from Washington) warned me about doing business in Oregon when I told him how well legalization in Oregon was designed to function, because he said the state of Oregon will just keep coming back to tax you more and more to fix whatever problems they have outside your industry. Let's not turn our cannabis industry into a pseudo legalization where only Idaho tourists are willing to pay our 30% taxes.
