When my now 6th grader was in kindergarten, I started attending the building search meetings and know that finding real estate here in Hillsboro has presented a unique challenge. Because Hillsboro is home to many 'silicon forest' companies, who will pay top-dollar for this prime location--real estate prices within the district are beyond the means of this small school. After many many hours put in by parent volunteers and staff, the school has found affordable real estate just a half-mile outside of the district and was hoping to purchase and operate the school from there.
