I am a parent of a student at City View Charter School. As the only public HSD charter school, it would be ideal for us to remain inside HSD boundaries. Many dedicated volunteers for CVCS have worked diligently for over a decade, trying to locate a space within HSD boundaries that meets the unique requirements of a K-8 school, with zero success. After years of searching, we finally found a site that could be our forever home.
