I am writing to say I support the passing of bill HB2696, I can attest that I have personally experienced under-qualified—rookie, or difficult to understand senior interpreters with stiff fingers in medical settings where misunderstandings can have severe consequences.

I had my reservations in the original bill HB3231. Having read the new bill HB2696, I am satisfied that there will be representation by deaf, hard of hearing, and deaf interpreters going forward, and I also heard that the cost to interpreting professionals has been reduced by changing the department responsible for processing payments. With that I am satisfied.
