I am a constituent of Representative Ruiz and Senator Gorsek and I vote. I support HB2800 and request you to report out with a "DO PASS" recommendation. We need a clear definition of what it means to discriminate "on the basis of age" and guardrails for employers to prevent them from using proxies for age and verbiage suggesting age preference in applications.
