Is HB 2245 a match requisite for the federal forestry management dollars appropriated by 117th U.S. Congress? Or was there no such stipulation in the federal law for the private corporate forestry owners so the Oregon Legislature thought would be generous Oregon taxpayer funds and bring tax breaks to corporate timber companies and the lumber mill industry conglomerates?

Better solution? May be to give tax incentives to small tract landowners, i.e. tree stand growers the tax credit and spread the carbon sequestration throughout the state.
