We know there are some here that shortsightedly wish only for the cheapest possible bottle to be on hand at every gas station, corner store and supermarket. That is obviously a less safe and secure system that what we have, and would directly result in not just our hundreds of Small Businesses being destroyed, but less choice, easier access by unqualified and underage actors and likely less variety, pricing fairness and equality of service to the Citizens of Oregon. We watched as the Citizens of Washington destroyed their system with a dismay similar to theirs as they now endure the terrible results.

But we also know very well that the Voters will, and should, have their say, and that Laws can change for reasons unforseen.

Our group efforts contribute a goodly amount of funding to vital State programs while helping the People of Oregon both inside and outside our stores.

All we are asking is that some of the fear and punishing losses that are the potential of such changes be reduced, and allow us a little more security in continuing our mission to provide exemplary service to the People of Oregon.
