I recently moved to Portland, where I am enjoying the wonderful dog parks in my neighborhood, especially Wilshire Park where I chase squirrels and gallivant with dogs of many breeds and dispositions.

HCR 8 will help other puppies like me grow up to be contributing members of families across Oregon. Rescue programs keep dogs like me from euthanasia or worse. I'm not an expert on cats. In fact, I find them to be intimidating and difficult to get along with. But in the spirit of bi-partisanship I am fine with shelter cats being state pets too. When it comes to dogs, I do know that dog ownership contributes to longevity. According to the <u>American Heart Association</u>:

- Heart attack survivors who live alone had a reduced risk of death if they owned a dog;

- Dog owners are less likely to die from a heart attack or stroke than non-dog owners.
