I want PERS and the entire Oregon Treasury to invest our funds responsibly and sustainably.

Most of us know we are in a climate emergency, but not everyone seems aware of how little time we have left – if we continue business as usual - before surpassing a global temperature rise of 1.5 degrees C with unknown extremes of climate instability. We need to plan and implement a swift, orderly transition away from dependence on fossil fuels, among other vital changes.

I understand from the Divest Oregon coalition that there is agreement between the coalition and Treasurer Read on the following:

- fossil fuel investments create risk to the Oregon Treasury
- the portfolio must be "decarbonized"
- green energy provides opportunity
- there must be accountability to the legislature

Even before the most recent report of late 2022, the Climate Scan Report of October 2021 by Ortec Finance, paid for by and presented to the Oregon Treasury, was a very clear call to divest from fossil fuels. That report predicted stranded assets as soon as this year. But I understand that our Treasury made half a billion dollars of NEW investments in fossil fuels just last month. Why? I believe we all have a right to know.

So, I add my voice to all who support HB 2601. Can a course correction of Oregon's Treasury investments safeguard the whole planet? Of course not. Do we need to do our part anyway? Of course we do!
