My name is Lara Arkin and I'm the mother of 5 children. I live outside of Cottage Grove and my husband and I chose to homeschool our children. I wholeheartedly support the Toxics Free Schools Act.

Although my children don't attend classes at public schools, my family would still benefit from strengthening school integrated pest management. My two oldest boys are very involved in school and community sports. Along with their teammates, they use public school grounds managed by the Cottage Grove School District for practice and games during after school hours and on the weekends. My two youngest children, ages 7 and 5, are just starting to play team soccer for our local school and community sports groups. At this age, they are likely to just enjoy being outdoors, doing cartwheels and rolling on the grass, and sitting on the ground in their soccer shorts with their bare legs exposed.
