On behalf of Ka 'Aha Lahui O Olekona Hawaiian Civic Club of Oregon and SW Washington (KALOHCC), I am writing to express **support for Senate Bill 610**, Food For All Oregonians which would ensure all of our neighbors, regardless of immigration status, have access to the food they need to keep them and their families healthy.

Hunger was a crisis in our communities well before the pandemic, and the health and economic impacts of COVID-19 have fallen hardest on newly-arrived Oregonians. Immigrants, refugees and Compact of Free Association (COFA) community members, in particular, have long faced higher rates of hunger and poverty in Oregon. Just one example: Latinx and Pacific Islander Oregonians experienced hunger at twice the rate of white Oregonians pre-pandemic¹ — and this gap has only widened as our communities continue to struggle with COVID's ongoing impact and the rising cost of living.

Senate Bill 610 will not only address the hunger crisis, it will elevate and create visibility of the limited resources, or lack thereof, to support the very needs of the community. The insecurities, feeling unsafe, not knowing if we can support our family, are just a few of the concerns that have taken a huge toll on the mental stability of our communities. Senate Bill 610 will help bring support to all families and help dismantle the barriers we have seen for far too long.

At KALOHCC, we know that when we all have access to food, we're all better off. SB 610 will allow kids to do better in school, our families' health and well-being improves, and our economy thrives through the support of local businesses. This will be true in every corner of Oregon—in rural, urban, and suburban communities alike. When all of our neighbors are getting the food that they need, all of Oregon thrives.

This is why we urge your yes vote on SB 610. Thank you for your time.
