So many providers couldn't meet the needs of my children. My children aren't hard children but commonly we ran into issues because of lack of training of staff at facilities.

I was fortunate and had a person to help me with it. I had other barriers as well that popped up and I had to figure out how to push things through.

There needs to be more support in getting started. More class availability would be great too. I have ideas on this, but I'll save that for another time. The purpose of my testimony is to state there is a problem with getting started and this bill could greatly benefit our communities.
