**RE: HB 2816 – Oppose**

Chair Marsh and Members of the Committee,

While we appreciate the intent of the underlying legislation, we have serious concerns with the unintended consequences of the bill.

*TechNet is the national, bipartisan network of technology CEOs and senior executives that promotes the growth of the innovation economy by advocating a targeted policy agenda at the federal and 50-state level. Our diverse membership includes dynamic American businesses ranging from startups to the most iconic companies on the planet and represents over five million employees and countless customers in the fields of information technology, e-commerce, the sharing and gig economies, advanced energy, cybersecurity, venture capital, and finance.*

The tech industry has and continues to lead the way on climate. Fifty percent of technology companies acknowledge the risk of climate change in their financial reporting, outpacing other industries.

HB 2816 targets data centers in Eastern Oregon and leaves harmless business west of the mountains. The data centers in Eastern Oregon generate incredible revenue for the cities and counties, provide jobs that would otherwise not exist, and fund much of our local economy. That is why mayors, city/county managers, county commissioners, and other local officials in Eastern Oregon are extremely concerned about this bill.

The legislation would force companies to seriously reevaluate their plans for Oregon, while jeopardizing the State's efforts to build an inclusive, world-class innovation economy. Real help would be found in enabling and expediting the build out of transmission capacity to bring more clean power to the grid.

Unfortunately, an amended bill does not address this fundamental challenge because HB 2816 provides no new tools or assistance to help companies or rural communities achieve their clean energy goals.

To effectuate real climate change, we need action from all businesses and people in the State; not a piecemeal approach that targets a single sector of the economy. To date we have not seen efforts for a task force, work group or an attempt at a coordinated discussion with local governments, energy providers or impacted industry.

We appreciate your consideration of our concerns with HB 2816 and look forward to the opportunity to meaningfully engage on this issue. Please don't hesitate to reach out if I can answer any questions.
