As an economist, I strong support the creation of a refundable tax credit for families with children, especially those in poverty or with low incomes. Oregon may not be able to create a tax credit on the scale of the temporary, federal tax credit created as pandemic relief, which would be better, but research clearly shows that 1) Our poverty line is too low. Consequently many social scientists who study

poverty consider the experience of people with income that's double or more the official U.S. poverty threshold.

2) Childhood poverty is a very strong predictor of future marginalization, low educational attainment, early childbearing, low income, unemployment, poor health and other challenges.

3) Even a small amount of money can make a big difference in parents' stress levels and children's performance in school and future success.
