Dear Members,


My name is Maria Elena Guerra, I am the Executive Director of the Farmworker Housing Dev. Corporation, an owner and operator of affordable housing in the Willamette Valley. FHDC has been serving Oregon rural areas for more than 30 years. We at FHDC believe that a home is the foundation for success. Every Oregonian should have access to opportunity, which begins with a safe, stable, affordable place to call home. When we invest in affordable housing and programs that reduce barriers to housing, we create an Oregon with a better future for all.

Housing costs are the largest expense for most Oregonians and as rents rise faster than wages, more people are having to make tough decisions between doctor's appointments, medication, car maintenance and housing. Housing vouchers and affordable housing is limited, and Oregonians can wait for years before getting assistance. Something else is needed to catch people who fall through the cracks.

As developers, owners and managers of affordable housing in rural Oregon, we believe that The People's Housing Assistance Fund will create a pathway for guaranteed income in Oregon so that Oregonians have the resources they need to thrive.
