More importantly, I am the single mother of a three-year-old who attends a local outdoor preschool. I cannot stress enough the benefit outdoor preschool has on my son's life and well-being. Research has shown the importance of time in nature for physical and mental health, and time spent outdoors is especially vital for children and youth. Nature is the ultimate playground, and I have watched piles of branches turn into boats sailing the sea as the children look for treasure, observed puddles become ingredients for making tea, and witnessed imaginary gardens planted and tended in the dirt.
