Re: SB 220 – Surcharge to Fund E-Permitting System for DOGAMI - SUPPORT

The League of Women Voters has a comprehensive position adopted in 1995 on Hazards, providing us with the opportunity to advocate for the Dept. of Geology and Mineral Industries (DOGAMI). We more recently studied Hard Rock Mining and adopted more positions upon which to advocate.

On February 16, we provided testimony on SB 5510, DOGAMI's budget request, POP 101, to implement a paperless permitting program. In 2021, we were interested in seeing this agency work with the Dept. of Environmental Quality on a shared e-permitting system. Since it was decided that DOGAMI would continue to move forward as a separate agency, it is important for this system to be funded. SB 220 creates a surcharge that will fund this e-permitting system. We assume that the program, once up and running, will continue to be self-supporting by fees to users of the system.

With that in mind, we support SB 220. We also support SB 221 and SB 222 to assure the system, once active, can collect those fees.
